CHRISTMAS PLAY



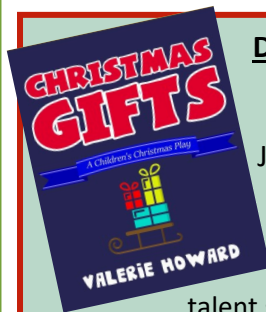

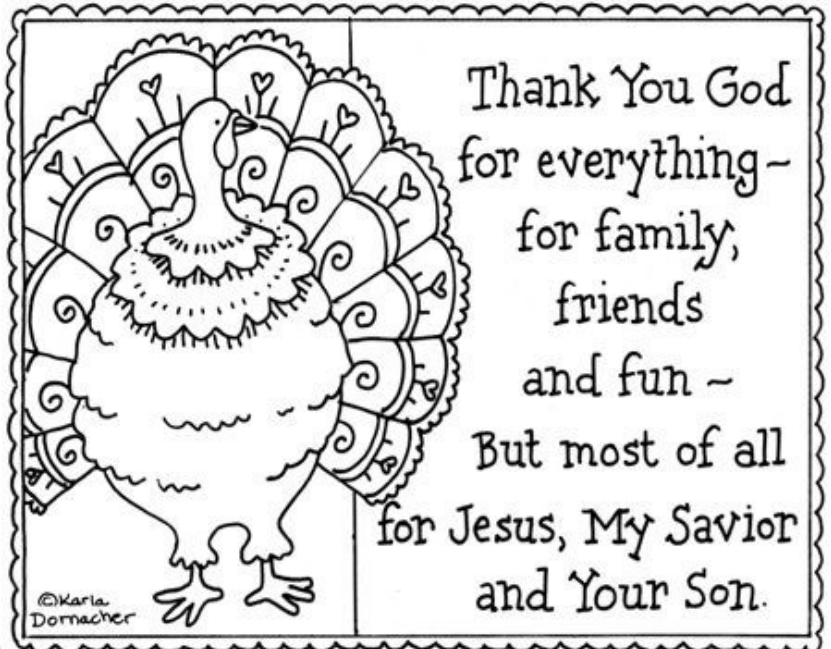

Finance Nuts & Bolts:

- Thank you to all who responded positively to Pastor Bob’s **Nomination Team** as they worked to fill positions for 2025. Your involvement is crucial to help lead Wesley through another successful year. It takes a “Village.” Thank you for contributing your talents, efforts, and being willing to help guide the mission of Wesley on the Hill.
- **Budgeting** for 2025 has begun, and this is a sobering review to find the dollars to not just maintain, but to improve and expand. The process also brings joy to those of us involved, as we reflect on a successful 2024 and all that Wesley is accomplishing. This is made possible by your understanding and support, sharing your thankfulness, and offering hope to those less fortunate. It takes a village, and our commitment starts over every year, but thanks to you we can plan, provide, and expand our mission. Thank you!
- **Consecration Sunday** is November 24th. Please prayerfully consider your contribution to our Lord’s work through Wesley. Our challenge is no different from our own family budgets and dealing with the cost of living. Wesley is just on a grander scale with larger challenges. Know that your consideration is greatly appreciated, and your support


helps make all things Wesley happen! Thank you in advance for sharing your gifts with Wesley.

- We are striving to be **good stewards** of your church and gifts. When you hear of small increases in our facility rental fees, know that this is just one example of our efforts to cover our costs when the event is not approved at no charge. Covering the electricity, heating, cooling, janitorial items, and general wear and tear allows us to “break even” instead of incurring an expense. As with our own households we must explore the use of our finances for our intended mission work.
- **Hope for the Future**, our Capital Campaign will reach our 2.5-year mark in November. Please keep sending what you are able toward this 3-year effort to reduce our overall mortgage amount, thus lowering our interest and ultimately our overall mortgage payments. In counting our Conference’s gift along with our own contributions, we appear to be on track to attain the goal we set for May of 2025. We will need a little extra in the spring of 2025 but knowing Wesley I believe we can do it!
- **Advent Envelope & Offering**, this year we will send half of your gifts for the work of The Marysville Council of Churches and their community work. With fewer churches over the years and low contributions we need to help prop up their important work for the good of all of us. The other half will go to prop up Wesley’s Current Expenses, to help start 2025’s bill paying on schedule.
- Speaking of them, **Current Expenses** continues to need our focus, especially as heating season and our high use time of year occurs on the hill. Please think of
